Patrick Woodcock is the Director of the Maine State Energy Office, a position he has held since January 2013.

Prior to that time, Woodcock worked for United States Senator Olympia Snowe in her Washington, D.C. office. In Senator Snowe's office Woodcock held the position as senior advisor to the Senator on energy and environmental issues and was one of the lead congressional staffers who authored the overhaul of fuel economy standards in the 2007 Energy Independence and Security Act. In addition, Mr. Woodcock was the primary advisor on Senator Snowe's energy agenda on the Senate Finance Committee. Woodcock attended Bowdoin College and holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Government.
