

Maine Government Summer Internship Program

The Maine Government Summer Internship Program places talented college students in internships in which they contribute to Maine state and local government. Interns gain meaningful work experience, make professional connections, and gain insight into career goals. The supervisors benefit from eager interns who care about serving Maine, bringing fresh perspectives and a variety of skills to their workplace.

The Internship Program is a full-time, 12-week, paid work experience. To be eligible, students must either be enrolled in a Maine college or be Maine residents enrolled elsewhere and have successfully completed at least two years of college. Students are chosen based on skills and interests; all majors are eligible.

This year 140 students from 46 different colleges and universities applied to the program. Fifty-two were selected and completed their internships. Thirty-seven interns were placed in departments of Maine state government, 12 in municipal governments, one in county government and two in regional planning agencies. A majority of internships were in-person while some remained fully remote or a hybrid.

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Each position has a direct supervisor who selects projects for the intern to accomplish and identifies the skills required for the jobs. A selection committee reviews all applications and makes the final selections. Consideration is given to education and skills in relation to the available internship positions. Since its establishment in 1967 by the 103rd Legislature, the program has placed more than 1800 students in Maine government internships.

This internship program is made possible by the support of the Office of the Governor, the Maine Bureau of Human Resources, the participating state agencies, local, county and regional governments and the dedicated employees who serve as intern supervisors.

A final reception was held at the Blaine House for interns and their supervisors. Below are some of the 2022 interns.



MAJOR PROJECTS OF THE 2022 MAINE GOVERNMENT INTERNS

The 52 summer interns were placed in various departments of Maine state government, in municipal governments, county government, and regional planning organizations. Interns are matched with a supervisor and are hired for specific projects while also assisting in general workflow. This list shows a sampling of the interns' activities.

Interns used research and communication skills to

- Work with the Assistant City Manager and Economic Development Director to research and plan revitalization projects that will bring community into downtown
- Create social media content including videos, job promotion content, TikTok content, and more; assess social media analytics to make improvements
- Conduct a compensation salary study to evaluate the competitiveness of the Department's current salary in the overall market; create employee new hire surveys, an engagement survey, and a critical role identification questionnaire
- Create informational webinars about best practices for navigating the medicare/medicaid system
- Deliver a summer college-prep program for students with disabilities (interview students, develop materials, participate in training) and then facilitate the program in-person
- Update economic data on the state website (county profiles, economic snapshot, workers with disabilities, and employment census); co-author the state's annual workforce report; and research and author a report on the impact of Maine's Apprenticeship Program
- Research electricity standard offer statutes and regulations in other states, Maine regulatory and appellate decisions involving a utility management efficiency adjustment, and the legal and regulatory requirements for utility rate case notices
- Analyze, quantify, and summarize public comments from Maine DOT's four major transportation plans, conduct a peer review for the Statewide Active Transportation Plan Needs Assessment regarding winter maintenance, and research and conduct interviews with other states to compare their policies to Maine's

Interns used scientific and technical skills to

- Develop a dashboard using Oracle Analytics to provide up-to-date, visually meaningful data to assist in decision making and measure the progress made on fiscal year priorities of interest to the Division
- Inspect petroleum remediation treatment equipment at active sites, collected air samples near known or suspected sources of contamination, collected water samples from point-of-entry treatment systems at PFAS sites, and monitored vapor mitigation systems
- Complete a burial census for cemeteries, map with ArcGIS, and build an electronic searchable database available to the public
- Conduct fieldwork survey for a federally listed endangered plant species
- Perform a buildout analysis to evaluate proposed zoning and ordinance changes for our city, then write a report and present it to the city planning board.
- Conduct weekly acoustic bat surveys at two training sites: setting up complex acoustic detection devices, retrieving, processing and analyzing data to determine species presence, followed by writing a report of findings
- Perform a heating ventilation and air condition (HVAC) energy analysis of a new commercial building
- Create a database of energy invoices for over 50 facilities and produced reports for electric, natural gas, propane and fuel oil based on the heating degree days to determine facility efficiencies
- Collect nationwide salary information on judge payroll, analyze it with SQL programming and provide court leadership with a web-based report. The reports will be used by the Chief Justice to decide what to request in the biennial budget to be decided by the Governor and the Legislature
