

Maine Government Summer Internship Program

For more than 50 years the Maine Government Summer Internship Program has placed talented college students in paid summer internships in which they contribute to Maine state and local government. Interns gain meaningful work experience, make professional connections, and gain insight into career goals. Their supervisors and co-workers benefit from the work of students bringing fresh perspectives, a variety of skills, and new energy to their workplace.

The Internship Program is a full-time, 12-week, paid work experience. To be eligible, students must either be enrolled in a Maine college or university or be Maine residents enrolled elsewhere and have successfully completed at least two years of college. Students are chosen based on skills and interests; all majors are eligible.

This year 140 students from 40 different colleges and universities applied to the program. Forty-eight were selected and completed their internships. Thirty-nine interns were placed in departments of Maine state government, eight in municipal governments and one in county government.

Each position has a direct supervisor who selects projects for the intern to accomplish and identifies the skills required for the job. A selection committee reviews all student applications and makes the final selections.

Consideration is given to education and skills in relation to the available positions. Since its establishment in 1967 by the 103rd Legislature, the program has placed nearly 2000 students in Maine government internships.

This internship program is made possible by the support of the Office of the Governor, the Maine Bureau of Human Resources, participating state agencies, local and county governments, and the many dedicated employees who serve as intern supervisors.

PROJECTS OF THE 2023 MAINE GOVERNMENT INTERNS

The 48 summer interns were placed within the executive branch of Maine state government and in positions of town, city, and county governments. Interns are matched with a supervisor and are hired for specific projects while also assisting in general workflow. This list provides a sampling of the interns' activities.

Interns used research and communication skills to

- Research policies to strength early childhood education systems
- Conduct outreach related to Maine's pharmaceutical take back program
- Help develop MaineDOT's Carbon Reduction Strategy
- Develop arguments in opposition to an appeal submitted by an opposing party to the Law Court (Maine's highest court)
- Create social media content including designing infographics and filming & editing reels
- Assist municipalities in completing their biennial municipal recycling progress reports for MaineDEP
- Research and write a history of Maine transportation (from pre-1600s to date) while also crafting and posting historical content to the Department's social media
- Coordinate the adult ed multilingual institute by networking, organizing, and planning everything from presenters and location to scheduling and food
- Help plan and carry out a 2-week residential Step-Up program for college-bound kids with autism
- Create a "How Do I..." page on the City of Bath website, working closely with the City Manager's Office for outreach to residents
- Perform legal research in support of various filings, including a brief to the State Supreme Court and Maine Public Utilities Commission
- Perform data analysis, research and site visits to analyze and improve Maine's inventory of tourism experiences

Interns used scientific and technical skills to

- Review the City of Saco's capital plan, providing analysis and identifying capital needs
- Use lidar data to create an inventory of structures on off-shore islands served by the LUPC and which will be used to analyze the effects of sea-level rise and other climate change-related impacts
- Create a Cemetery Map App which allows the viewer to search between the five cemeteries that the Town manages with interactive headstonepoints showing names and specific plots
- Create a drone program for dam safety, including training for all dam safety staff to minimize risks to the team
- Conduct weekly acoustic bat surveys for endangered species at two training sites: processing and analyzing data to determine species presence, and writing a report of findings
- Perform a road analysis project for the town, surveying surface and drainage conditions on all public roads, measuring, photographing and ranking them
- Create a municipal inventory map featuring all of the Town of Union's municipal property (bridges, boat launches, dams and fire hydrants) Edit and finalize a GIS layer used in reviewing applications to rezone for development, and write a report with proposals for making it a public-facing tool
- Curate one of MaineDOTs online databases (Confluence Wiki), meeting with stakeholders and updating content
- Conduct fieldwork surveys to identify a federally listed endangered plant species
